Esme Blunden for her persuasive letter asking to bring John Daniels back to Uley.

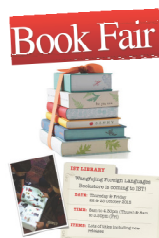
## IT'S A BOY!

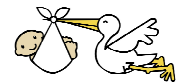


## FATHER'S DAY CELEBRATIONS
