10 points

Art, Design and Technology

Create your own 3d junk model of a dinosaur. Your model can be created with lego, paper, card or any other household objects you can find. You will receive extra points if you model has moveable parts. **10 points**

Values

Write down an example of a time when you showed courage.

5 points.

Geography

Choose 5 different dinosaurs and plot where they lived on a map. The dinosaurs must be from at least 2 different continents.

5 points

Be the best you can be

Find and research an athlete who showed one of the Olympic and Paralympic values.

8 points.

Art, Design and Technology

Sketch a dinosaur skeleton of your choice.

10 Points.

ICT

Create a PowerPoint about one of your favourite dinosaurs.

10 points.

English

Create a tricky word search or crossword using different dinosaur names or dinosaur vocabulary.

5 points

Maths

Some T. Rexes were 6 metres tall. Measure your family with a tape measure and write down their heights in order.

5 points

Create your own piece of homework linked to Dinosaurs.

5 points

History

Find out which dinosaur was the smallest/tallest/fastest/heaviest.

RE

Retell the biblical story of Easter in a comic strip.
