Design Technology

Build any type of mill using a material of your choice e.g. lego, cardboard, lollipop sticks, cake, gingerbread...

10 POINTS

Music: Family Challenge!

Ask friends and family to think of songs which have at least one of the following words in the title: water, mill, sheep, wool, hill. Which family will come up with the most?!

5 POINTS (10 POINTS TO THE WINNER!)

Physical Education

Mills are famous for their rotational movement. Choose a sport that involves rotation and bring in a photograph of you doing it. The more 'sports you try, the more team points you can collect!

3 POINTS (for each sport!)

Science and History

Choose a significant inventor during the Industrial Revolution. Research their life and discover more about their discovery, then film a TV documentary to share with the class.

Maths

10 POINTS

Research an interesting fact linked with our topic then create your own Maths codebreaker for the class to solve so that they can read it.

Art and Design

Create a beautiful watercolour painting of a water-powered mill. (Please ask if you require some thicker art paper for this).

Any subject!

Uley Mills, the woollen trade, workhouses, Industrial Revolution...focus on one of our hot topics and create an exciting homework all of your own. 5 POINTS

Geography

Explore a map of the local area — can you find signs of mill life? Create your own 'Mill Map' to show the location of 10 different mills in the Stroud area. Can you label any additional features which link with the mill industry, such as streams and springs? Show the location of these using a key to accompany your map.

Languages and Computing

Uley is particularly famous for producing blue broadcloth.
Research how to say 'blue' in as many other languages as you can find and then present these translations using 'Wordle'.

Values and Be the best you can be!

Write a recipe for friendship. Think carefully about the qualities that would be required.

Religious Education

If you were God and had to create your ideal world, what would you include or omit? Create a piece of work to show your ideas.

3 POINTS

English

It is 1890 - imagine that there has been an accident at one of the local Mills. What happened? Write a newspaper article to tell the villagers about this shocking event. Can you make the article look realistic too?
