Isabelle for being reflective on her own behaviour and encouraging others to do the same.



Momo Updates

Understandably, parents and schools are increasingly concerned due to the intense media coverage and the story being further fuelled by 'YouTubers'. Unfortunately this has led to some individuals adding doctored videos to YouTube and YouTube for Kids which have then been spread across social media as "proof" that the challenge exists. A message from Victoria Brinton, Cyber Protect Officer at Gloucestershire Constabulary

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents of the need to discuss internet safety with their children to ensure they know not to add / talk to strangers and that usage is supervised. Many of the stories seen have involved young children (mostly between the ages of 6-9) who have come across videos whilst using YouTube, an app rated for 13 year olds and over, unsupervised. We are also aware that some doctored videos have been added to YouTube Kids but the platform is working to get these taken down.

Enrichment Sessions

Mrs Pugh will continue our Enrichment Sessions this term and the summer term. As the year has progressed, we have made some tweaks including the size of the groups and we have created a simple baseline to support us in identifying areas for focus and monitoring any impact.

What are Enrichment sessions?

Mrs. Pugh and Mrs. Mandeville (SENDco) working with the class staff, identify children who may benefit from some time during an afternoon, once a week, out of the classroom, to engage in activities that support the children to meet the social and intellectual demands of school life, improving their self-confidence and self-esteem, through a carefully planned curriculum.

The aims of our nurture group will be:

- To develop children's self- esteem
- To develop children's social skills
- To provide a calm environment
- To build relationships between adults and children
- To help the children grow in confidence, trust and reliability
- To provide a secure environment where children learn
- To provide the children with nurturing care from caring adults
- To help children learn the consequences of certain behaviours
- To work in partnership with parents and school staff to ensure consistent approach
- To prevent possible exclusion

This, of course, will be working in conjunction with you, as parents. Parents will be fully involved along the way. If you would like more information, please come and speak to Mrs Pugh or Mrs Mandeville.

Family Support Liaison

Don't forget Mrs Lisa Hills is available to speak to on a Monday. Mrs Hills works alongside the staff at Uley to deliver an extra layer of support for the parents and carers of our pupils, providing individually tailored practical and professional advice, and guidance on all aspects of parenting as well as working with pupils.

'I am here to help and support all children and their families with any difficulties they may be experiencing including (but is not exclusive to) anxiety, behaviour, mental health support, housing and benefits and additional needs.

I will be at school every Monday from 9.30am until 2.30pm, if you would like to book an appointment to see me, please leave a message with Mrs Mandeville or the school office'

Family Information Service

The Family Information Service offer a wide range of information to support families, children and young people from 0 - 19 years of age (25 for young people with additional needs). This includes information on finding and choosing childcare, such as local day nurseries, playgroups, childminders, children's centres, out of school clubs and holiday play schemes.
