<p>Love of the written word</p> <p>Write a story about being in the Roman Army. Don't forget to use speech marks!</p> <p>Can you type it onto a word document? Add pictures!</p> <p>20 points</p>	<p>Maths, science and analysis</p> <p>Create a maths game using Roman Numerals e.g. snakes and ladders but the dice is in Roman Numerals!</p> <p>15 points</p> <p>Use purple mash to create a leaflet all about life in the Roman Army.</p> <p>20 points</p>	<p>Music and dance</p> <p>Create a Roman march- can you include different positions? Can you create a drum beat to go with it?</p> <p>15 points</p>	
<p>Freedom and fun</p> <p>Draw a Roman from a description. Ask someone to read what they look like and have a go at drawing them! No Peeking!</p> <p>15 points</p> <p>Create a famous Roman building using Lego/ junk model. E.g. Colosseum</p> <p>10 points</p> <p>Choose 1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Create a painting of a Roman.• Make a Roman Mosaic.• Make a Roman Shield/ helmet or spear. <p>20 points</p>	<p>'Emperors and Empires'</p>  <p>They are like trees that grow beside a stream that bear fruit at the right time and whose leaves do not dry up.</p> <p>They succeed in all they do. Psalm 1:3</p>	<p>Love of the written word</p> <p>Choose 5 words- find out what they are in Latin! Write them out and practise saying them. Record yourself saying the Latin words.</p> <p>10 points</p>	<p>Church and community</p> <p>Find out about the Roman Gods- Are any of their beliefs similar to ours today?</p> <p>Draw a mind map to show your findings.</p> <p>20 points</p> <p>Take a walk around the Church yard- is there anything there from Roman Times?</p> <p>20 points</p>
<p>Drama and self-expression</p> <p>Re-create the Roman invasion of Britain using puppets. You can make the puppets if you wish!</p> <p>20 points</p> <p>Dress up as a Roman- take a photograph!</p> <p>5 points</p>	<p>Awareness of our place in the world, geographically and socially</p> <p>Create your own homework based on what we are learning!</p> <p>Romans, Tennis, Rounders, Pounds and Pence</p> <p>15 points</p>	<p>Debate an openness</p> <p>Who was the fairest ruler of the Roman Empire?</p> <p>Explain your choices with evidence!</p> <p>Record as a mind map/ fact-file or your own choice.</p> <p>15 points</p>	<p>Sport and fair play</p> <p>Did the Romans play sport? Research and find out! Present as a video of you doing it!</p> <p>15 points</p> <p>How many times can you bounce a tennis ball on a racket? Record as a video or photograph.</p> <p>5 points</p>
