Graham Wilkes - visit during anti-bullying week and meeting the CHIP Council

On Friday 18th November 22, I had the pleasure of my first governor visit of the academic year. The visit was to see the anti-bullying week campaign and to meet the CHIP council to find out from a children's perspective how the week had gone.

The first part of my visit was to see the big buddies and little buddies working together to make kindness fortune tellers. The majority of this visit took place in Class 4 where I had the opportunity to witness first hand one of our newest staff members Miss Morris. After watching a small video Miss Morris explained the task in hand and what struck me most was the clarity that tailored to all year groups in the class. It was explained and from speaking to the children they fully understood the task which was to make the teller and for the end results when you played with the fortune teller was to say "I like the way my buddy.....", "What is being a friend...." "How does my buddy make me feel.....". The end result was of the 8 fortune tellers I saw all of them met the criteria and

all had positive comments around their buddies. Thank you Morris for a lovely lesson executed perfectly with brilliant results. I did briefly tour the other classrooms and the approach in all classes was consistent and the same message given to all.

The second part of my visit was to meet the CHIP Council. After the initial shock of finding out it wasn't the chips you eat, I met an absolutely brilliant group of children. They took me through what activities they had been doing for the week. They had been asking children across the school a different question each day to ensure the "Reach Out" National Campaign was delivered in the school. They asked questions like What Bullying is? Who can you speak too if you have a concern? What is banter and how it can affect people? It became very clear quickly that our school value of compassion is embedded in the school and children are aware of what is good and appropriate behaviour, which as a governor and a parent, was lovely to hear. I asked each of the children to give me an example of someone they could reach out too and every child gave me a different answer which they achieved promptly. I would like to say a big thank you to the CHIPS for the work they have done over the week and for communicating that to me late in the afternoon.

Reflecting on my visit I truly believe that the whole school have a clear understanding of the 'Reach Out' campaign. Thank you again to all pupils and staff for achieving this.

Anti-Bullying Week

The week started with Odd Sock Day and there were a lot of odd socks. I just hope you all managed to get your pairs of socks back together again! The children really appreciated the purpose; to celebrate difference.

Throughout the week, the children engaged in activities that focused on types of bullying, identifying bullying, the roles within bullying – perpetrator, bystander, victim and what to do. They worked on scenarios to distinguish between falling out, friendship problems and bullying, and of course, REACHNG OUT, the theme of this year's anti-bulling week.

The Chip Council sought children's views around how safe they feel in school and in the playground, and all the children completed an annual questionnaire. All results to follow soon. We updated the Anti-bullying Policy and have adopted the Anti-bullying Alliance definition:

Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online.

The younger children focused on our school value of friendship and looked at kind and unkind behaviours.

Towards the end of the week, the children spent time together in teams and with their buddies focusing on working together, acts of kindness and being kind to each other.
